
Audiences

Audiences

Groups of people who share similar values, beliefs, metaphors, and emotions about a social issue we call audiences.

Audiences also share similar cultural consumption patterns, which afford critical insights to people making media to reach them. Some audiences are regularly exposed to new ways of thinking about poverty and financial wellbeing in the media they consume, for instance, while other audiences may be absorbing more entrenched viewpoints.


We identified four distinct audiences. In the slides that follow, we offer some general comparisons, then detailed profiles of each audience.



Values distinct

Each audience has fundamentally different values. So even if they share the same beliefs about the causes of poverty, they are likely to have different attitudes about it, and different perspectives on possible solutions.

We use survey questions to illustrate key values distinctions.




Cultural domains

One of the places where all kinds of culture meet is YouTube. We located cultural domains or "centers of gravity" for each audience by reading tags on more than 400,000 audience-viewed YouTube videos. The result is a map of the distinctive cultural domains for each group, with their proximity to one another.

PEOPLE POWER favors lifestyle content: fashion, relationships, parenting, fitness. IF YOU SAY SO is all about games. TOUGH COOKIES engages with news nearly twice as much as other audiences. DON'T TREAD ON ME shares a lot with TOUGH COOKIES, but some unique interests are car repair, sports, and comedy.

TOUGH COOKIES spend more time with online news (5.2%) than any other audience—especially as it relates to COVID, the stimulus, and crime. They tend to favor the well ordered black-and-white, us-versus-them worlds of Westerns and police procedurals. While politically diverse, they do pay attention to Trump on Twitter.







Before COVID, TOUGH COOKIES would have tended to view social safety net programs as "hand-outs." Not anymore. They're also uniquely associated with a cluster of articles thematizing "heroes," "protectors," and "resilience." However, given that they consume so much more crime-related content than other audiences, there's a risk that they see BLM through a "crime and disorder" lens.

Racially and politically diverse—about a third identify as Democrat, Republican, and Independent, respectively—TOUGH COOKIES are the oldest group. More than half are over 55. Full demographics.





Poverty view summary

Really only two distinct views of poverty emerged in the survey. One view held that unfair systems deprive people of opportunities, so to end poverty, systems need to change. The other view held that everyone has an equal opportunity to succeed, so to end poverty, people need to change, with respect to values, work ethic, and/ or other personal habits. These views on poverty are consistent with worldviews held by PEOPLE POWER and DON'T TREAD ON ME, respectively.


One could argue that the view held by IF YOU SAY SO and TOUGH COOKIES constitutes a distinct third view, a messy middle ground that is both non-committal and deeply resigned.



Poverty view summary


One could see these views as a kind of continuum. This continuum is a useful bridge to connect our audiences to the narratives about poverty they tend to encounter in the media.





Media artifacts communicating something that happened to someone or something. Also referred to as documents. Can be broken down into smaller units, or snippets, for analysis.




NARRATIVES

We don't need to rely on complex statistical calculations to see the harm being done to some workers. Simply look at how employers have reacted. A decade ago, Crider Inc., a chicken processing plant in Georgia, was raided by immigration agents, and 75 percent of its workforce vanished over a single weekend. 

"Even though we are 10 years into an economic recovery and the unemployment rate is under 4%, working people are still not seeing the kinds of robust wage growth that those at the top have seen for decades," said EPI Policy Director Heidi Shierholz. "The increase in strike numbers shows that workers understand that joining together in collective action remains an effective way to raise wages and benefits, and improve working conditions."

In 2019, there were 10 work stoppages involving at least 20,000 workers, the largest number since 1993, when BLS began providing data that made it possible to track work stoppages by size. The largest strike involved nearly 50,000 workers walking out of General Motors factories across the country with the goal of preserving job security, improving wages, and retaining health care benefits. The six-week strike ended with a United Auto Workers contract that improved wages, stayed health care costs, and committed investments for American factories.

30,000 workers also went on strike in 2019 at Stop & Shop, a New England-based grocery chain, over a drastic increase in health care costs. The 11-day strike concluded with the United Food and Commercial workers and Stop & Shop agreeing to a contract that preserved health care benefits, increased wages, and maintained time-and-a-half pay on Sunday for current employees.

"The resurgence in recent strike activity has occurred despite current policy that makes it difficult for many workers to effectively engage in their fundamental right to strike," said EPI Policy Associate Margaret Poydock. "Corporate influence has eroded labor law and allowed worker protections to stagnate. We need fundamental labor law reforms like the PRO Act in order to bring worker protections into the 21st century."

Since the recovery began in late 2009 and 2010, our Gross Domestic Product has maintained a steady rate of annual growth. The S+P Stock Market significantly improved in 2009. To date, it has not grown any faster under Trump than it did under Obama in 2013. Trump is riding an economic growth wave initiated by his predecessors.

The Labor Department reported Friday that the U.S. economy added 273,000 new jobs during the month, while the unemployment rate was 3.5%, matching its lowest level in more than 50 years. An alternative measure of joblessness that counts those not looking for work and holding part-time jobs for economic

reasons edged higher to 7%.

The January and February gains tied for best month since May 2018.

Economists surveyed by Dow Jones had been looking for payroll growth of 175,000 and a 3.5% jobless level. Average hourly earnings grew by 3% over the past year, in line with estimates, while the average work week, considered a key measure of productivity, nudged up to 34.4 hours.

There was more good news for the jobs market: The previous two months' estimates were revised higher by a total of 85,000. December moved up from 147,000 to 184,000, while January went from 225,000 to 273,000. Those revisions brought the three-month average up to a robust 243,000 while the average monthly gain in 2019 was 178,000.





"President Trump's budget represents yet another massive redistribution of wealth from low-income and working class families to the top 1 percent," said Raymond Castro, health policy director for New Jersey Policy Perspective, a progressive research group.

"His budget proposes devastating cuts to health and social programs - possibly the largest cuts proposed by a president in the nation's history - and threatens to push far too many families into poverty. Meanwhile, wealthy individuals would receive a windfall as the budget makes the 2017 tax cuts permanent.

Trump's \$4.8 trillion budget proposal revisits rejected cuts

Indeed, Trump's proposed cuts to Medicaid and subsidies for so-called Obamacare health insurance policies total almost \$1 trillion over 10 years, according to calculations by the liberal-leaning Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, whose president, Robert Greenstein, called the Trump plan "stunningly harsh."

Trump would also revive a plan, rejected by lawmakers in the past, to cut food stamp costs by providing much of the benefit as food shipments instead of cash. He's also proposing work requirements for safety net programs like Medicaid, food stamps, and federally subsidized housing.

Other cuts, outlined in an annual "Major Savings and Reforms" volume that's ignored every year, include eliminating heating subsidies for the poor and \$405 million worth of grants to boost community service work by the National Endowment for the Arts, and subsidies to states such as California saddled with high costs for jailing criminal migrants who enter the country illegally.

Louisiana Estimates 31K Impacted by New Food Stamp Work Rule

Louisiana's social services agency says as many as 31,000 of the state's food stamp recipients could lose their benefits under a new Trump administration rule starting April 1.

The rood stamp changes are the Trump administrations latest attempt to scale back social safety net programs. The USDA estimates the new rule will save about \$5.5 billion over five year by cutting benefits for hundreds of thousands of people. The rule imposes stricter criteria state must meet in order to issue waivers.

Attorneys general in nearly 20 other states have sued. They are attempting to block the rule, saying it could lead to increased homelessness and health problems.

Louisiana's waiver for the 14 parishes will last one year, through March 31, 2021. The state coul seek waivers for additional parishes later if they reach the federal requirement of having an unemployment rate of 6% or higher and meet other high unemployment benchmarks.

Because of the federal changes, Gov. John Bel Edwards is rescinding a 2016 executive order the enacted some job training requirements for non-working, childless adults in Louisiana who receive food stamps. The federal rule is stricter than those requirements.

Andrew Cuomo Has Stepped Up For New York, But Black Folks Should Still Be Leery Not everyone is enamored with New York's governor even amidst the high praise for his leadership.

One of the biggest criticisms is about the state budget released in late last month and issued by a Governor Cuomo-appointed board that calls for \$400 million worth of cuts to hospitals over the next year. This report was issued during the current pandemic. The purpose of the board was to "redesign" Medicaid (the healthcare low-income populations rely on) and figure out how to rein in a projected \$4 billion budget gap.

Additionally, Governor Cuomo signed into law measures that roll back recent bail reform measures. The reforms were "designed to prevent people charged with mostly misdemeanors and nonviolent felonies from being locked up before their trials simply because they can't afford to pay bond," according to MotherJones.

This means that judges can go back to keeping low-income people accused of misdemeanors in jail for longer periods of time. Those who can not afford cash bail will now once again face the possibility of going to jail before their trials, a prospect that is particularly risky amid this pandemic and would potentially fuel more COVID-19 cases in New York's jails.

Trump's darkness: White supremacy, Christian nationalism and the coronavirus

This pandemic has brought out the worst in Trump — and in his most racist and fanatical

For example, black Americans are much more likely to be both hospitalized and die from the coronavirus than are other groups in the country. There are many factors which explain that disproportionate outcome

These include the relationship between stress, racism and negative health outcomes, and the history of racial housing segregation and related exposure to pollutants and toxins. Black Americans are also far more likely than whites to work in "essential" jobs in the public sector or the service industry, where they do not have the luxury of working from home and must risk exposure to the coronavirus every day.

Black Americans also experience economic insecurity at higher rates than other groups. So they are less likely to have access to health care and are very likely to continue working even when sick because of a lack of savings and other financial resources.

Instead of trying to lessen this dramatic social inequality — which affects the working class and poor more generally — the Trump regime is continuing its efforts to overturn the Affordable Care Act and related programs. Public health experts have repeatedly shown that decreasing access to health care will make the coronavirus pandemic and its long-term society-wide impact much worse. This is especially true for nonwhites, poor and working-class Americans, and other groups who rely upon the Affordable Care Act.



How Minneapolis, One of America's Most Liberal Cities, Struggles With Racism

The Midwestern city that has been the site of unrest views itself as embracing multiculturalism. But it also struggles with segregation and racial gaps on education.

Yet a shift in influence and representation has been slow coming. In 2018, Minnesotans elected Representative Ilhan Omar, a Somali-American and Muslim who is the first woman of color to serve the state in Congress. And disparities in employment, poverty and education between people of color and white residents are among the worst in the nation.

Hundreds of rats are currently living in Liberty Park and could spread diseases through their feces and human contact, among other ways, Tammy Vigil, a spokeswoman for the Denver Department of Public Health and Environment told The Denver Post.

"The reason the rats are so big is because of all the food that's left there — all the food waste that's not thrown away," Vigil said.

The closure is likely to last weeks, Ann Cecchine-Williams, the department's deputy executive director, said.

The number of tents in the park grew in recent weeks after a Denver County judge ruled that the city's urban camping ban amounted to cruel and unusual punishment. Police have not been enforcing the ban in the two weeks since the ruling but City Attorney Kristin Bronson has said she planned to tell police to resume enforcement sometime this week.

Texas governor picks new fight over homeless after attack




